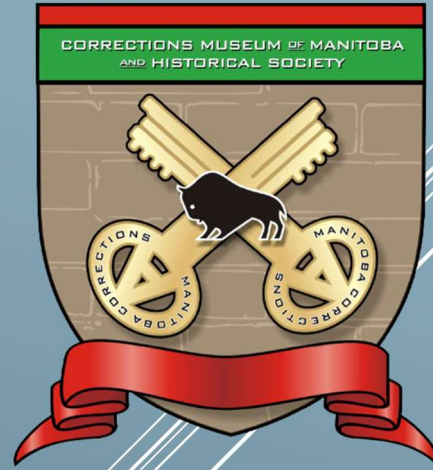


# 2019 CORRECTIONS MUSEUM OF MANITOBA & HISTORICAL SOCIETY ANNUAL REPORT
